



In addition to this, some children represented Pixmore at the Stevenage and North Herts Schools Writing Awards last night. With 18 schools represented and taking part in the competition (about 5,500 children in total), the quality of the writing produced by all of the children in the project this year was incredible so there was some very, very tough competition. While none of our Pixmore children won the overall Best Writers for the competition, I was exceptionally proud of them nonetheless.

#### Arrival times and Registration

Just a reminder that the school gates open at 8.30am. Your child needs to be in the classroom between 8.40-8.50am as **the registers close at 8.50am**. We are having a number of children arrive last minute just before the gates close and as a result are either being marked as not in school (largely because they're still walking to their classes or putting their things in the cloakrooms) or late. Please ensure your child is at school and in the classroom by 8.45 in order for them to have time to put their things away and be sat down for the registers.

#### Car Parking

Just a reminder that only those parents with 'Pixmore Parking Passes' or those with a Blue Disabled Badge should be parking in the school car park. Pixmore Parking Passes are issued by the school office at the discretion of the Headteacher.

The beginning and ends of the day are extremely busy with children and families entering the school site. Staff parking takes priority within the school grounds but we know we have some families with children who have mobility or medical conditions that cannot walk far who also need to be able to drop off in the car park. In addition, on occasion we also have taxis booked to collect children. For safeguarding reasons, these taxis need to be able to enter the car park so staff can ensure that the children are safely put into the taxis.

Our car park risk assessment does not allow for more than a set amount of vehicles within it for health and safety reasons. Hence, <mark>if you do not have a Pixmore Parking Pass or a Blue Badge displayed, Mr</mark> Anderson will ask you to park along the road from Monday 12<sup>th</sup> February.






#### **Attendance and Punctuality**

Our currently attendance for the whole school has stayed at 92.7% as a result of the winter bugs we've experinced over the last month or so.

We want to ensure that children are in school are attending regularly as our target for the year is 96% for the whole school so please do ensure your child is in school as much as possible. Our termly visit by the County Attendance Office is on 19<sup>th</sup> March where they will be asking us questions about pupil attendance and supporting us in considering referrals for some of our families.











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We will continue to review and monitor attendance daily and will call to find out why your child is not in school if we have not had a message. We currently have a large number of children in the school who are classed as <u>persistent absentees</u> – these are children who have be absent from school regularly and whose attendance is at 90% or below. Any child whose attendance drops below 50% is classified as a <u>Severe Absentee</u> and we would be looking to involve the School Attendance Team with these children and families.

However, as we continue to have some of these nasty bugs going around, we do understand that children get sick and as parents, you know if your child is **genuinely** unwell and cannot attend school. Please do let us know if this is the case.

We have a child in school with a compromised immunity. As such, please make us aware if your child has been in contact with any contagious illness, including Strep A, Scarlet Fever, COVID19, or has another contagious illness. It is important we notify the parents as soon as possible so they can act on the information. This need not be the case with coughs and colds. If your child has sickness and diarrhoea, please keep them at home for 48 hours.

The PSA have lots of events planned for the rest of the year. Thanks to those who met last week to help plan the events for this term.

After half term, we will be holding an Easter Raffle this year instead of the Easter Egg Hunt. Over the past two years, the PSA have not raised much money from the Egg Hunt so we will be holding a House Colour themed raffle. More details will follow closer to half term.
