ArtsMark Gold Award

Something extremely positive to start our newsletter this week! Over the past few terms, Mrs Thomas has been working hard to pull together all of the evidence we have to see if we can be awarded the Gold ArtsMark Award. We have previously held the Silver Award for a number of years but have had a real focus on arts opportunities over the last 2 years. We have taken children to local art galleries and museums, increased our musical instrument offer across the school, been involved in a Letchworth-wide project that saw our children's work displayed in a local gallery and has contributed

to a scheme of work, which all children in the town can be involved in. Children performing at the Royal Albert Hall and in more local community contexts, such as The White House Care Home before Christmas, has all lead to us being awarded the Gold Level ArtsMark.

Behaviour Ladder

We have been speaking to the children in assembly as we do at the start of every half term about our Pixmore Way – our behaviour ladder. In school, we have high expectations of children's behaviour and we expect them to be 'Ready to Learn', 'Respectful' and 'Safe'. Our behaviour ladder sets out our expectations and we request that parents support us in reinforcing these messages with their children to ensure that Pixmore is a positive, happy and safe environment for all of our pupils and staff to work in. We are **TeamPixmore** and we need pupils, parents and staff to work together for the benefit of our whole school community.









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Alongside our behaviour ladder structure for managing poor behaviour, we also recognise when children have gone above and beyond our expectations. We recognise 'Role Models', those children 'Showing Pride' and for those 'Superstars' who always go above and beyond.

It is important you follow the Pixmore Way (rule of law) at all times so that you are ready to learn, you can show respect and keep yourself and other people safe. We will know you are ready, respectful and safe if you:

- Show tolerance for the views of other people (mutual respect)
- Look after property and the school environment
- Take ownership of regulating your emotions and actions
- Take pride in your work and other peoples work
- Always ask permission to leave the classroom
- Show patience, share and wait your turn
- Are helpful and offer to do jobs for your teacher
- Market Tell the truth
- Keep to your own personal space

Safe

- Mow how to keep yourself and others safe
- Walk around school in the Pixmore Way
- Wear correct uniform
- Show Pixmore sitting
- Speak to an adult about worries or concerns
- Follow Pixmore e-safety rules in school and out

World Book Day – Friday 8th March

We will be celebrating World Book Day on Friday 8th March in school with a range of activities including the Scholastic Book Fair. We are giving children the option of coming to school dressed as a character from their favourite book but keeping who they are a secret as we will be playing a Guess Who? Game during the day. If children do not want to dress up, we are asking that they bring in a clue as to who their favourite character is e.g. Harry Potter – they could come with a lightning scar drawn on their foreheads.

We will be holding the Scholastic Book Fair after school on Wednesday 6th – Friday 8th March in the dining room. The children will get their World Book Day vouchers on Thursday which they can put towards the cost of a book at the book fair.

Parent Questionnaire 2023-24

We will shortly be sending out our annual parent questionnaire to request parents' views on issues such as barriers to attendance and engagement, curriculum opportunities and enrichment. We would very much value your feedback on these topics as it helps us to review and develop our curriculum and school offer for our children.

Staff Changes in Years 3 and 4

Year 3 and 4 parents will already be aware that Mrs Horner will be leaving us on 22nd March to take up a SENCO post at a school closer to home in Bedfordshire. Mrs Horner has previous experience as a SENCO and this is a role we know that she will excel in. We will be extremely sad to see her leave us but I am pleased to say that Mrs Johnson, who has been working in Year 4 this year, will be moving









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down to take over 3H from 18th March. Parents will have the opportunity to meet Mrs Johnson and say goodbye to Mrs Horner at our open afternoon on 19th March.

However, we won't be leaving Year 4 bereft as Mrs Walters will be joining our team to support the children in those classes from 11th March as she gets a little time to work alongside Mrs Johnson to get to know the children and the team better. These handovers are crucial to ensuring the smooth transition of staff for the benefit of the children.

The rest of the Year 3 and 4 teams, including support staff, will be staying the same in order to maintain consistency for the children.

We hope parents join us in wishing Mrs Horner the very best in her new role.

School Dinners

We have worked with Dolce for the last few years to try and avoid increasing the costs of school dinners but unfortunately from 1^{st} April 2024, we will need to increase the cost of a school dinner to £3.10. This will be the equivalent to £1.75 increase over the course of a week; approximately 35p per meal. This means that a week of dinners will cost £15.50 a week from 1^{st} April instead of £13.75.

Arrival times and Registration

Just a reminder that the school gates open at 8.30am. Your child needs to be in the classroom between 8.40-8.50am as **the registers close at 8.50am**. We are having a number of children arrive last minute just before the gates close and as a result are either being marked as not in school (largely because they're still walking to their classes or putting their things in the cloakrooms) or late. Please ensure your child is at school and in the classroom by 8.45 in order for them to have time to put their things away and be sat down for the registers.

Car Parking

Just a reminder that only those parents with 'Pixmore Parking Passes' or those with a Blue Disabled Badge should be parking in the school car park. Pixmore Parking Passes are issued by the school office at the discretion of the Headteacher.

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

Attendance and Punctuality

Our current attendance for the whole school has stayed at 92.7% for the last few weeks.

We want to ensure that children are in school are attending regularly as our target for the year is 96% for the whole school so please do ensure your child is in school as much as possible. **Our termly visit by the County Attendance Office is on 19th March** where they will be asking us questions about pupil attendance and supporting us in considering referrals for some of our families.



We will continue to review and monitor attendance daily and will call to find out why your child is not in school if we have not had a message. We currently have a large number of children in the school who are classed as <u>persistent absentees</u> – these are children who have be absent from school regularly and whose attendance is at 90% or below. Any child whose attendance drops below 50% is classified as a <u>Severe Absentee</u> and we would be looking to involve the School Attendance Team with these children and families.

We will be sending out our end of spring term attendance reports at the end of this term and where we have concerns, parents will be invited into school to create an attendance improvement plan for their child.
